How can you celebrate Family Literacy Day at home?

Here are some literacy activities children and families can engage in together connected to this year's *Travel the World Together* theme:

- 15 minutes of daily reading; consider fables or stories from around the world
- Follow an international recipe together and get cooking
- Go online and research a country you'd like to visit together
- Write a prayer or poem together
- Write English words and phrases and use a translator to learn how to say them in other languages
- Imagine you are at a world destination and write a postcard to a friend
- Search popular songs from other countries on YouTube and sing, dance and move together as a family; try to guess what the lyrics might be about

We look forward to celebrating *Family Literacy Day* as a school community together and can't wait to see our student and family contributions to this school-wide project.
